What an incredible year! The F.R.E.E. Foundation is keeping Virginians more mobile than ever before! In 2022, our locations across the state, served 3,227 people, enabling greater independence, shortening hospital and rehabilitation stays, and equipping patients to thrive at home and in their communities. Our clients gained functional mobility, balance, and health improvement that they could not acquire through any other means.

F.R.E.E. achieved new milestones in 2022, reaching deeper and wider in with our services than ever before. We supported Virginia health systems during medical equipment shortages, helping 98% of our clients return to and remain living safely at home. In the last six years, F.R.E.E. has more than doubled our services by extending our community relationships and becoming the go-to program for adult charitable medical equipment reuse in Virginia.

Partnerships with the Virginia Department for Emergency Management, the Red Cross, Virginia Department for Aging, Virginia Assistive Technology System, and F.R.E.E. ensures the most vulnerable in our state have access to medical equipment during disaster events in Virginia.

In 2022, we provided 5,023 pieces of durable medical equipment to Virginians

valued at \$1,106,169 and specifically tailored to meet clients' needs. From our first nine clients served in 2000, to over 3200 served this year, the F.R.E.E. Foundations has scaled into a high-performing, nationally recognized, statewide charity that meets patients where they are, enabling sustainable strategic growth and expansion to serve this growing commonwealth. This growth will continue in 2023, adding new service locations, community partners, and state agency alliances.

F.R.E.E. is true to its roots and Mission – to acquire and provide mobility-related rehabilitation equipment to maximize functional independence and improve quality of life. But we continuously strive toward our Vision of a Virginia where EVERY need for mobility-related rehabilitative equipment is fulfilled!

WHO WE ARE

The Foundation for Rehabilitation Equipment & Endowment (F.R.E.E.) is a volunteer-led, nonprofit organization based in the state of Virginia. F.R.E.E. has seven full-service Virginia programs in Roanoke, Richmond, South Hampton Roads, Williamsburg, Lynchburg, and Winchester.

WHAT WE DO

We collect, sanitize, repair, and gift donated mobility equipment to low-income, uninsured or under-insured adults in Virginia. F.R.E.E. acquires and provides mobility-related rehabilitation equipment to maximize functional independence and improve quality of life of the people we serve. Our service includes two main parts: the people we serve and equipment we reuse. Intake data is gathered through a client application and a letter of medical necessity to qualify clients and match equipment to meet their needs.

OUR OVERARCHING GOALS

- Assist individuals to whom equipment is not otherwise available.
- Be a model program for other communities.
- Develop partnerships with like-minded organizations.
- Combine community resources to maximize our ability to reuse durable medical equipment.

Statewide Efforts

F.R.E.E. worked closely with our partners Virginia Department for Aging and Rehabilitative Services, Virginia Assistive Technology System, and the Virginia Department for Emergency Management to prepare three "Ready-To-Go" durable medical equipment shelter kits. These kits were developed during "Blue-Skies" and are ready at a moment's notice, when needed to assist people with disabilities in Virginia during disasters.







Working with the American Red Cross of Virginia's Disaster Relief team, F.R.E.E. provided 29 smaller DME disaster relief kits. These will be deployed on disaster relief trailers, as needed in Virginia to assist the most vulnerable local residents during crisis events. This DME will aide individuals with new injuries or replace DME lost in a disaster.
